Ontario Vaccine Passport System

On September 1, the Government of Ontario announced that it will be introducing a proof of vaccination system (vaccine passport) that will be required for a patron to access specific, non-essential businesses. The new system will take effect on September 22 and will stay in place as long as is deemed necessary under the *Reopening Ontario Act*. Examples of where proof of double vaccination will be required for entry are included below:

- Restaurant/bars indoor (outdoor dining or patronage will be up to the individual establishment policies);
- Nightclubs;
- Meeting spaces, conferences;
- Sports, fitness, and community centres
- Casinos:
- Concerts; and
- Sporting events

While proof of vaccination will be required to patronize non-essential business, it will <u>not</u> be required for employees working at these businesses.

The OSWCA has developed a template vaccination policy with the assistance of Norm Keith (KPMG Law). The template is available for download on the OSWCA website and will be accompanied by a webinar on September 8th, where Norm Keith will walk through the latest on workplace vaccinations and where the federal and provincial laws are headed on this issue.
